The United Nations (UN) and its partners in Azerbaijan have been actively supporting the country in its efforts to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which encompass 17 interconnected and ambitious targets addressing major development challenges faced by people in Azerbaijan and globally. Through collaborative efforts, Azerbaijan prioritized 17 SDGs. 88 targets, and 119 indicators has environmental spanning the economic, social. and dimensions of sustainable development. This concerted action underscores Azerbaijan's dedication to the 2030 Agenda.

Government Commitment and Institutional Framework: In 2016, the President of the Republic of Azerbaijan issued a Decree establishing the National Coordination Council for Sustainable Development. This council serves as a pivotal partner for the United Nations in channeling support to the Government of Azerbaijan. It acts as a coordinating body to streamline efforts towards achieving the SDGs, reflecting the government's commitment to sustainable development.

Strategic Planning and Acceleration: Azerbaijan has taken proactive steps to accelerate SDG implementation, exemplified by its participation in a MAPS mission (Mainstreaming, Acceleration, and Policy Support for the 2030 Agenda). This mission provided a comprehensive roadmap outlining concrete policy and programming measures to expedite national progress toward the SDGs. The experiences garnered

from this endeavor were shared at the 2018 Baku Forum on Sustainable Development, facilitating peer learning and regional collaboration. Notably, the adoption of the Baku Principles during this forum set forth provisions for integrating SDGs into national agendas and expediting their implementation.


Data Monitoring and Reporting: Recognizing the importance of data-driven decision-making, Azerbaijan, with UN support, launched the National Information Portal on SDGs. This portal serves as a centralized platform featuring an interactive dashboard that aggregates and presents real-time data on SDG progress. This initiative enhances transparency, accountability, and evidence-based policymaking. Moreover, the UN assists Azerbaijan in strengthening its national statistical capacities to ensure the production of quality data, with a particular emphasis on disaggregation to leave no one behind.
